Overview: Reading Detectives is a fun, small group class that helps students understand and think about what they read. By the end of the course, students will be well-prepared for the literature-based essays and writing assignments they will encounter in middle school, equipped with strategies that make reading deeper and writing stronger. Instruction is informed by Orton-Gillingham-based practices and delivered through explicit instruction and engaging games and multi-sensory activities that make learning feel fun and approachable. Students will practice connecting sounds to letters, building and changing words, and applying phonics skills through explicit, multisensory instruction embedded in games. The focus is on confidence, repetition, and meaningful practice—helping students build strong foundational reading skills while enjoying the process.

10. Fluency Studio: Reading With Expression

Overview: Fluency Studio is a supportive, low-pressure class that uses "Reader's Theater"-style reading to help students strengthen reading fluency, comprehension, and expression. Students practice reading aloud using short scripts and books. The goal is not acting or memorization, but learning how punctuation, phrasing, and meaning shape fluent reading. Through modeling, guided practice, and repeated reading students work on reading sentences smoothly, accurately, and with appropriate expression. Emphasis is placed on understanding the text so that reading sounds natural and meaningful, not rushed or robotic. The class will end with a simple, celebratory culminating

project, such as a recorded group reading or shared reading experience, shaped by the needs and interests of the group.

Through hands-on games and activities students develop a deep understanding of numbers—beyond memorization. Children will explore counting, comparing quantities, visualizing numbers, early addition and subtraction, and problem-solving using visuals, manipulatives, and cooperative games. The focus is on building confidence with numbers, developing number sense and creating joyful math experiences.

SEL1. Friendship Explorers: Social Skills, Emotional Regulation and Anxiety (Grades 1-3)

Facilitator: Dr. Lindsay Reddington

Overview: Friendship Explorers is a small, supportive summer group designed for children ages 6–8 who struggle with social interactions, emotional regulation, or confidence around peers. Many children in this age range want to make friends but feel held back by big feelings such as worry, frustration, or overwhelm.

Through play-based activities, games, stories, and guided peer interaction, children learn how to:

- Build and maintain friendships
- Communicate their needs and feelings
- Manage big emotions that come up during play
- Practice flexibility, turn-taking, and problem-solving

The group provides real-time coaching and support, allowing children to practice skills with peers in a safe, encouraging environment. Skills are taught in developmentally appropriate ways and reinforced through hands-on activities rather than worksheets or lectures.

Overview: Social Navigators is a small, supportive group for children ages 9–12 who struggle with friendships, social confidence, or managing emotions in peer settings. As social expectations increase in upper elementary and early middle school, many children feel overwhelmed, misunderstood, or unsure how to connect successfully with others. This group helps children strengthen both social skills and emotional coping strategies, recognizing that anxiety, frustration, and self-doubt often interfere with peer relationships. Through discussion, interactive activities, role-play, and real-time practice, children learn skills they can use immediately in school and social settings.

Children will learn how to:

- Initiate and maintain friendships
- Read social cues and respond flexibly
- Manage anxiety, frustration, or shutdown in social situations
- Communicate assertively and handle conflict
- Build confidence in group and peer interactions

The group provides guided coaching in a safe, nonjudgmental environment where children can practice new skills, reflect on experiences, and feel less alone in their challenges.

Many children in this age range want to connect with peers but feel held back by worry about being judged, making mistakes, or not fitting in.

This group helps children understand how anxiety and self-confidence impact friendships and peer relationships. Through discussion, interactive activities, and guided practice, participants learn practical tools to manage anxious thoughts, regulate emotions, and feel more confident navigating social and academic situations.

Children will learn how to:

- Manage worry, overthinking, and fear of judgment
- Build confidence in social and group settings
- Navigate friendships and peer dynamics more effectively
- Communicate assertively and set healthy boundaries
- Cope with mistakes, setbacks, and uncomfortable emotions

The group emphasizes skill-building and experimentation, allowing kids to practice new strategies in a safe, nonjudgmental environment. Rather than focusing on perfection, Confidence Lab encourages flexibility, resilience, and self-trust.
